Serpentine Wildflower Hike at Tolay Creek Ranch

Celebrate Earth Day by experiencing the rare serpentine wildflower field in full bloom on the Sonoma Land Trust's Tolay Creek Ranch.

Tolay Creek Ranch, nestled between Lakeville Highway and Highway 121 in Southern Sonoma County, harbors an area of serpentine soils that are home to an abundant assortment of native and rare plant species — creating an awe-inspiring display of native wildflowers and grasses in the springtime. The views of the Bay Area from the ranch are spectacular, too!

This evening outing will be led by SLT staff and a naturalist. The hike itself is not lengthy, but there is no trail and we will be walking over large areas with uneven footing.
